Welcome to 6th grade! For your summer reading project, you will be reading the book *The Pharaoh's Daughter* by Julius Lester. You are responsible for reading the whole book and creating a **Chips and Salsa Visual Tool** in order to track the character development throughout the book.


Choose one of the main characters to follow their development from the beginning of the book to the end. In your visual tool, you must include:

- <u>3 events/influences from the beginning</u> (what the character experienced or actions they took that impacts who they are, answering the "why" the character is the way they are)
- <u>3 adjectives/ character traits about character at the beginning</u> (can either be physical or personality traits; for ex. the character is smart because they went to school or the character likes to play basketball because they are good at it and they are tall)
- 3 events/influences from the end (focus on how the character has changed throughout the book; for example, they were shy in the beginning because they didn't have any friends, but became a lot more outgoing because they met some people that they could be friends with; meeting the friends would be the influence, and outgoing would be the trait)
- <u>3 adjectives/ character traits about character at the end</u> (how would you describe the character by the end of the book)

You will then be responsible for writing a one-paragraph (at least 5 sentence) description of the ways that the main character changed throughout the book, using your visual tool as your guide. This project will be done on a normal, 8.5 x 11 piece of paper (visual tool on one side, paragraph on the other).

This project must be turned in on the first day of school, Tuesday, September 3rd, with this rubric page attached. You will also be **quizzed** on the events of the book when you return.

Please refer to the rubric and evaluate yourself to make sure you included all components of the project. As a reminder, plagiarism is taken very seriously at our school and projects will receive **zero credit** if plagiarism is detected.








