I hope you have a wonderful and restful summer break. Included in this letter is your summer reading assignment for the upcoming 2020-2021 school year. The purpose of this assignment is to keep your mind sharp, prepare you for the upcoming school year, and to be a source of enjoyment for you! The Hobbit by J.R.R. Tolkien (required reading)

For The Hobbit, answer the following questions in detail.

Please answer in at least one full paragraph (6-8 complex sentences) per question.

- 1. Much of your freshman year was dedicated to discussing the idea of the hero. Tolkien chooses an unlikely hero for his novel, Bilbo Baggins. How is Bilbo a hero? What qualities does he possess that demonstrate that he is a hero of sorts? Construct a guiding thesis ("Bilbo is a hero of sorts because....") and then give specific details from the story to support your answer.
- 2. Every good character through literature must undergo some sort of change. How does Bilbo grow or change throughout The Hobbit? Cite three specific places in the book where you see him undergo some change. What causes the change and what evidence is there that he is different after the experience?
