The purpose of this assignment is to keep your mind sharp, prepare you for the upcoming school year, and to be a source of enjoyment for you! Assignment # 1

Assignment # 2

Read *The First World War: A Very Short Introduction*, by Michael Howard. The book is available used at Amazon, and the ISBN you want to search for is 978-0199205592. Please read the text, and then list and explain three key points about the war. This can be finished in writing or print. This will be due on 3 September.

Assignment # 3

Please gather ten words through the course of the summer that you are unfamiliar with. As you do so, record where and when you encountered the word, and then gain a definition of the word, the part of speech, and write a sentence that correctly uses the word. You will present your ten words in class on 5 September, when this is due. This assignment will be a Project grade for Quarter 1.
